# Libraries, Access to Information, and the SDGs (IFLA, 2015)

- Libraries support universal literacy (information, digital, media) with the support of trained and skilled library staff
- Close the gaps in access to information and help the government, civil society, and economies to understand local information better
- Provide networks of delivery sites for government programs and services
- Promote digital inclusion through access to ICT
- The Library as the heart of the research and academic community
- Preserving and providing access to the world's culture and heritage

- Public access to research data and information, and resources that give people opportunities to improve their lives
- Facilitate learning and getting new skills needed for education and employment
- Information to support decisionmaking by government, civil society, and businesses to combat poverty



## Access to information

**Target 16.10:** Ensure public access to information and protect fundamental freedoms, in accordance with national legislation and international agreements.



## Smart Library

- Library fitted with technology
- With or without staff and still available to the public
- With transformed operations and services through the integration of strategic design and implementation of advanced technologies
- Cloud computing, data mining, artificial intelligence (AI), smart technologies, i.e. drones, 3D printing, IoT, RFID

- 7. Smart and innovative services


## Skills required to survive 4th Industrial Revolution (4thIR)

## Libraries and Open Access

- "There is an absolute need to remove restrictions to disseminate research output to intended stakeholders, irrespective of their geographic and financial status of those institutions and individuals seeking Information" (UNESCO, 2015)
- "As the world enters a new era of sustainable development, openness and inclusiveness in scientific research will become increasingly critical" (COAR, 2016)
- "... open access has led to a vast refocusing of services for academic libraries around the world with a significant proportion of research being produced by their academic and research community, which then published every year" (Mamtora and Pandey, 2018)

# New roles for librarians and information professionals

- Assist authors with rights and permissions
- Maintain scholarly communication websites
- Organizers of workshops on copyright issues and digital scholarship
- Advocates and initiators of discussions and shaping of Open Access (OA) policies
- As educators and trainors for other librarians and students

## Open Access and Sustainability

- OA is key to achieving the SDGs, which are reliant on improved access to information and knowledge
- There is a clear link between OA and access to information, and sustainable development
- OA ensures that there are knowledge gained
- OA benefits can match each of the 17 SDGs
